>> Karren – Dornbirn's local mountain with a new perspective



Freshly renovated and thoughtfully redesigned with a focus on nature and comfort, the Karren now welcomes guests more warmly than ever. The modernized valley station combines clean architectural lines with a nature-inspired experience. The cable car journey itself, running every 15 minutes, becomes part of the adventure offering expansive views across the Rhine Valley. Upon reaching the summit, a panorama stretches all the way to Lake Constance. New recreational areas invite visitors to relax, while the optimized layout provides greater tranquility and enjoyment. The "Karren-Kante" remains a highlight: twelve meters of glass and steel jutting boldly over the rock face - a thrilling viewpoint.

Whether hiking, cycling, or dining in the panorama restaurant - up here, everyday life feels worlds away.

Travel tip: From Götzis railway station, buses and trains run to Dornbirn every 10-20 minutes – convenient, fast and sustainable.

Hohenems – history, culture and pure enjoyment

Hohenems captivates visitors with its historic Old Town and vibrant cultural life that seamlessly blends tradition with modernity. The Jewish Museum makes the region's rich past accessible in a moving way – through open dialogue and contemporary presentation. Just steps away, the new Vorarlberg House of Literature in Villa Rosenthal invites you to immerse yourself in the world of words. A true highlight is Hohenems Palace: Renaissance splendor meets modern purpose – with concerts, exhibitions and readings bringing the historic building to life. For culinary



delights, visit Fenkart Chocolate World, featuring handmade pralines and unique chocolate creations. The town center has been carefully restored, featuring charming boutiques, cafés and artisan workshops. The Schubertiade enjoys international acclaim – the world's largest Schubert Festival gives Hohenems its distinctive musical resonance.

Travel tip: It's just a ten-minute train ride from Götzis to Hohenems.

100 years united – Feldkirch celebrates



In 2025, Feldkirch celebrates 100 years of united districts. Under the motto "Feldkirch one hundred. Growing together" the Montfort town invites you to an anniversary full of encounters.

The centerpiece is the exhibition "Where we meet" at Palais Liechtenstein: artistic perspectives on the city's history – free admission Tuesday through Saturday. But Feldkirch fascinates visitors beyond its anniversary year: the medieval Old Town with its arcades, markets, and historic facades invites you to take a stroll. At the Ardetzenberg Wildlife Park, visitors can observe native animals and enjoy panoramic views over the city. Culture meets modernity in the Montforthaus: architecture, concerts, and culinary delights – the E3 terrace offers a spectacular panoramic view. And in between? Simply drift along: through cafés, galleries, or the weekly market.

Travel tip: From Götzis railway station, you can reach Feldkirch's city center in just 15 minutes.

Sound spaces and cultural treasures – discover Schruns & Tschagguns

In the Montafon region, culture, history and landscape blend together to create an unique experience. The area is home to one of Austria's most impressive collections of organs: 16 historic instruments spanning four centuries transform the valley into a resonant cultural space. Notable highlights include the Schruns Minster – Vorarlberg's only minster since 2020 - with its clean architectural lines and serene atmosphere, along with the precious Bergöntzle organ in Tschagguns, a masterpiece dating from 1816. The Schruns Local History Museum takes visitors on a journey through time – from rural life to the dawn of tourism. For a delightful break, visit the Löwen Inn: regional, steeped in tradition, with stunning views of the Rätikon peaks. The Great Walking Tour (approximately 7.5 km) through Schruns, Gantschier and Tschagguns combines exercise and culture - perfect for leisurely exploration. For an even more peaceful experience, try the valley hike to Silbertal - ideal for unwinding.

Travel tip: It's just a 50-minute train ride from Götzis to Schruns.

"The Tschengla circular trail on Bürserberg in the Brandnertal is my insider tip. Starting from the Tschengla hiking car park, you follow the leisurely family hiking trail towards Alpe Rona. Along the way, you'll pass fascinating stone circles and a natural Kneipp water-treading facility. During this pleasant hike, an impressive panorama of the surrounding mountains unfolds, including views of the Zimba peak.

A detour to Alpe Rona is particularly worthwhile, whether for a short breather, to refuel with their homemade Alp cheese, or simply to admire the idyllic landscape. Perfect for unwinding, recharging your batteries, and enjoying the natural world!"

"Hello, my name is Gar Leyshon and I coach 8 time Hypomeeting champion Damian Warner. This year will be my 10th trip to Götzis and over the years Damian and I, along with coach Dennis, have developed a number of traditions. For example: on the Thursday before the meet we usually drive up the narrow and at times frightening Meshach road right out of Götzis and east past the Gasthaus Berghof. From there you can find a number of paths, one of

which leads to the cliff overlooking Götzis and the whole Rhine Valley, from the big snow capped Mountains in Switzerland to the south and west all the way to lake Constance in the north. It is spectacular! But our most enduring tradition when we go to Götzis, besides winning the Hypomeeting, is to visit Bregenz. We take the Pfanderbahn to the top of the mountain and eat lunch – schnitzel MIT frites of course – in the lodge overlooking Lake Constance and on a good day you can see Switzerland, Germany and Austria as well as the full length of the 63 km long lake.

If you are in Götzis for the Hypomeeting take the time to visit Bregenz and Lake Constance and get some ice cream, you will not be disappointed!"
